

IMPLANT CASE STUDY

THE CASE

A 26-year-old male presented to the office for a second opinion on an anterior implant. The patient was in a mountain bike wreck a few months prior. He lost the left central incisor and chipped two lower anterior teeth.

During the first visit we restored the lower anterior teeth with composite resin and created a temporary replacement bridge out of a denture tooth and orthodontic wires. The patient appreciated having this temporary bridge instead of a tooth on a removable retainer.

The oral surgeon then placed the implant and the pontic was replaced after the surgery during healing time. After integration of the implant a crown was placed.

Due to the bone and tissue loss from the trauma of the bike accident, the ceramist used gum-colored porcelain to fill the gap between the two left incisors.



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RESULTS

These results are possible through careful planning and a team-oriented approach between the surgeon, general dentist and lab technician.
